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### **Course Description:**

Congratulations on choosing Punjabi Language and Culture 10 and welcome! In this course, you will be presented many opportunities to discover and enhance your skills in both the Punjabi language and Punjabi culture. This is an introductory course intended for students who are beginning their study of Punjabi language and culture. For some of you it is the very first time that you will be learning Punjabi language and for others who already have some knowledge of Punjabi or a family connection to the culture, you have the opportunity to maintain contact with the language, culture and heritage.

Punjabi Language and Culture 10 course is made up of two key components. In one component, students will have the opportunity to learn four primary language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) learn the Punjabi alphabet followed by the Punjabi vowel symbols. Students will then be able to read, write and speak simple Punjabi words. The following grammar rules and basic sentence patterns will also be covered. For example Parts of the speech such as nouns, pronouns, adjectives; simple sentences in present tense, past tense, future tense and some interjections will be covered in the course.

This course will prepare students for Punjabi Language and Culture 20.
