Course Description:

Congratulations on choosing Punjabi Language and Culture 20 and welcome! In this course, you will be presented many opportunities to discover and enhance your skills in both the Punjabi language and Punjabi culture. This is an intermediate level course intended for students who have successfully completed Punjabi Language and Culture 10. For some of you it is the second time that you will be learning Punjabi language and for others who already have some knowledge of Punjabi or a family connection to the culture, you have the opportunity to maintain contact with the language, culture and heritage.

Punjabi Language and Culture 20 is made up of two key components. In one component, students will have the opportunity to review the Punjabi alphabet, grammar, and vowels and expand upon four primary language skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) at the intermediate level. For instance, improve oral production and comprehension, increase vocabulary. Students will also be able to read, write and speak simple Punjabi sentences.

This course requires the pre request Punjabi Culture and Language 10 and prepares students for Punjabi Culture and Language 30.

Competencies	For students to be successful in Punjabi Language and Culture 10, they need to be able to appreciate and positively critique their work and receive that criticism from others. They must build a sense of trust so they feel comfortable taking risks to increase their creative and educational knowledge. Students will be encouraged to: • participate (mostly in trying to speak Punjabi in class) • maintain a positive and respectful attitude • come prepared and on time for class • complete homework and cooperate with teacher, classmates, and guests		
Students who are unable to meet these expectations will be identified early in semester and may be			

placed on an individualized program of study that may include a reduced number of credits, should they complete the course with a passing mark.

Course Materials and Resources:

Students will be required to bring stationary such as a binder/notebook and writing utensils - preferably a pen *and* a pencil. All assignments (writing assignments, projects, portfolio, etc.) must be completed and are due at the beginning of the class period on the assigned date.
